HERD HIGHLIGHT: Cumberland Island Horses by Erin Phillips



Unknown to many, wild horses inhabit an island in southeast Georgia called, Cumberland Island. The island is 36,420 acres and it is believed that between 150-200 wild horses live on this island. The wild horses are unmanaged, so there is no way of knowing their actual population numbers.

Cumberland Island is filled history. The First African Baptist Church, Plum **Orchard** Mansion, Greyfield Inn, and the Dungeness are a few of the historical sites on the island. Undoubtedly, the Dungeness is the most famous after mysteriously burning down many years after it was vacated. The wild horses Cumberland are descendants of Spanish horses brought to the island and other domestic horses Carnegie Family owned.

IS IT THE CHOPPING BLOCK FOR THE TRNP WILD HORSES?

In January, Wild Horse advocacy groups from around the country weighed in on the National Park Services' environmental action plans to re-evaluate the livestock plan for the wild horses in the Theodore Roosevelt National Park. A few of the options for the proposed plan included: immediate removal of the wild horses, a gradual reduction of the horses over time to a population of zero, and an option of reducing the herd to a population of 30-70 animals (currently there are almost 200).

The park service held an online virtual Q&A on January 12, where the public was invited to submit questions to be addressed. The transcript of that meeting, along with an analysis of the comments and questions submitted may be found here: <a href="https://dx.ncbi.nlm.ncbi.

It was wonderful to see so many people RALLY TOGETHER to support the preservation of the Teddy Roosevelt Horses! Many government officials joined in to urge the NPS to not only keep the TR horses, but to keep a genetically viable number of horses in the park! TCF was thrilled to watch this press conference from ND Governor Doug Burgum in support of the horses: <u>Gov. Doug Burgum TR Wild Horses Press Conference</u>.

The NEPA Scoping Period closed on January 31, 2023. The NPS is now formulating final alternatives and preparing their EA. They will release the EA for public comment this summer, and the final NEPA Decision Document will be released this Fall. Will all of this fantastic support sway the Park Service from its original mission to eradicate the TR Wild Horses?
